### Boys lacrosse

Coming off a championship in the Midwest Scholastic Lacrosse Coaches Association Tournament in Detroit over the weekend, the Golden Bears are gearing up for the Ohio High School Lacrosse Association Division I state tournament.

The Bears could begin play in the state tournament as early as today.

Arlington will face the winner of a Tuesday game between Toledo St. John's Jesuit and Thomas Worthington. If St. John's won, the Bears would host them today because the Titans have graduation Thursday.

If Worthington won, the Bears will host the Cardinals Thursday.

The game will start at 6:30 p.m. either day and the winner will advance to the regional final Saturday.

The Bears (16-1) won the top (A) bracket in the MSLCA with a 10-3 win over Brother Rice, avenging UA's only loss of the season, and with Sunday's 7-5 triumph over Western Reserve Academy.

Alex Drake Scored four goals Saturday and two Sunday and Eric Hanover scored twice in the win over Brother Rice.

While winning the Midwest is always a goal for the Bears coach Ted Wolford said the OHSLA state tournament is always at the top of his list of goals.

"As we always say, it's one of those things in most cases winning the Midwest tournament is harder than winning the state because of the level of competition," Wolford said. "But as far as getting respect and which one impresses your friends the most, winning the state is more impressive. And there's also that extra thing that says you'd like to finish off your season and send off your seniors with a win."
